



Rolleston on Dove enjoyed a sunny late summer Bank Holiday to stage the Village Fayre and Duck Race.

The previously popular Gala always took place on this date until the 2020 pandemic occurred, so after a long gap it was good to see local families out enjoying a traditional event.

With a community-wide effort, support of many local businesses, private sponsors and an energetic crowd of volunteers, the day ran really smoothly and was a welcome return to the village calendar.



This time, the venues were Rolleston Club and the historic 17th century Old Grammar School in the grounds of St Mary's church which saw almost 400 entries in a variety of classes, from fruit & vegetables to flowers, from cakes to preserves, and art to photography.

2nd Chapter Book Club

This quarter there were plenty of novels published in the 1980s & 90s for us to choose.

The first was 'Fried Green Tomatoes at the Whistle Stop Café' (yes, really) by Fanny Flagg. Set in Alabama in the 1980s, it weaves together the past and present through the blossoming friendship between Evelyn Couch, a middleaged housewife and an elderly Ninny Threadgood who lives in a nursing home, which Evelyn visits every week. An excellent raconteur, Ninny tells Evelyn stories of the people of Whistle Stop where her sister-in-law Idgie and her friend Ruth ran a café. These stories, which cover life in Alabama from the 1920s to the 1980s, along with Ninny's friendship, enable Evelyn to begin a new and satisfying life while allowing the people and stories of Ninny's youth to live on. The writer explores themes of family, aging, lesbianism, and the dehumanising effects of racism on both black and white people. The novel is engaging; the narrative explores the issues through the differing characters and events often humorously yet poignantly never belittling the difficulties the characters face in their lives. This is a heartwarming book which provided a deep sense of enjoyment.



Moving on to the 1990s, we read 'About A Boy' by Nick Hornby which examines growing up (or failure to do so), keeping life at bay (even when it rings the doorbell for the whole length of tv show Countdown) and the friendship of two adolescents.

Marcus is 12 and having trouble fitting in at school. Will is 36 and having trouble fitting into life. Independently wealthy, he fails to see the point of things which consume others of his age such as having a job, babies, and love. He can see the point of attractive single mothers, though, and to meet them joins a single parent group in search of sex. He must invent a child of his own, Ned. Through this group Will meets Marcus whose mother, Fiona, is a suicidal depressive. Will's friendship with Marcus, at first grudging then resigned and finally desperate is both hilarious and touching. The development of both characters is carefully, at times tenderly, revealed. Marcus wants to set up his mum with Will thereby expanding his family of two, a dangerous position to be in bearing in mind his mother's depressive state, to three. Attaching himself to Will, though fails to produce that outcome but Will helps him to manage the school bullies and grow more content with his life. Will learns to be less

insular as he is drawn to support Marcus and Fiona. The characters all have traits we could relate to and Hornby's narrative, his elegant prose, completely captured our attention.

We were honoured to have been nominated for Radio Derby's 'Make a Difference' award. We were finalists in the green category of these community accolades and although we didn't win the main award, we were delighted to have been included amongst so many other worthy projects.



Our monthly working parties continue on the first Sunday of every month from 10 until noon. We have lost a few volunteers over the last year, but gained many more and we have a healthy number turning up each month to help.

Our latest work has seen us plant 500 daffodil bulbs in the ground by the sides of the waterfall and this will be followed by the planting of 1500 bluebells early in 2024. We were also delighted that money was found to fund the installation of a reed bed at the top end of

Brook Hollows which will provide a new environment for wildlife and will hopefully help catch silt as it moves downstream.





Rolleston Station Heritage Group



As many of our followers know, the project to restore the remains of the village railway station began with a working model which first went public at a Community

Day at John of Rolleston Primary School in 2007. The school loaned us a classroom complete with projector, enabling the idea to be explained fully to visitors in both model and digital formats.

We were very keen to record the experiences of people who had travelled on trains such as the Tutbury Jinny, as well as the excursion trains that conveyed villagers to seaside destinations and more local places such as Alton Towers and Trentham Gardens.

The railway line passing through Rolleston became very busy during the later WW2 years by trains carrying munitions from the depot at Fauld to the seaports. On Community Day in 2007 a lady took great interest in the model, relating that her late husband had been a fireman working the trains conveying a highly explosive cargo. Great care was required when braking as one spark from a brake shoe applied to the wheels could cause a devastating explosion.

Throughout the ensuing years of exhibiting the model at various shows to promote the heritage station and Jinny Nature Trail, we have listened to many experiences of the station and its trains:

The lady who received a proposal of marriage whilst standing on the footbridge, unable to answer due to being engulfed in smoke from the Tutbury Jinny passing underneath. (She did say 'yes' eventually).

The goings-on aboard the Saturday only, late night Jinny, during WW2, conveying GI's back to Tutbury following a night on the town in Burton.

The gentleman passenger on a Great Northern Railway train who accepted a mint humbug from a fellow passenger, fell asleep, and woke-up miles past his intended destination, minus his wallet.

The other weekend we hit the road with our car loaded almost to the roof with the working model bound for an exhibition at Stafford. This was to be the final outing for the model; having been on the exhibition circuit for 16 years, we felt that there couldn't be any people remaining who would be able to share their railway experiences. How wrong could we have been!

Probably the layout achieved the largest number of onlookers to date at the Stafford

exhibition, but during the Sunday afternoon with the show in full swing, a lady beckoned me to talk to her father who was observing my version of the Tutbury Jinny passing through Rolleston-on-Dove station with great delight. Listening carefully to the gentleman's recollections proved to be a most fascinating experience; having arrived at Rolleston-on-Dove station at the age of two, at some date in the 1930's, he and his family spent their first night in the village at the Spread Eagle, before moving into a house known then as 'Burnside', opposite the brook on Burnside. He related to a number of families that I can recall residing in that area.

His greatest thrill during the WW2 years would be to observe the American locomotives hauling trains of US style 'boxcars' loaded with explosives, through the village station.

It is likely that these American locomotives would have been of the S160 class, a USA standard war department locomotive, designed to haul military traffic across Europe in the days following the D-Day landings. A number came to Britain first from 1943 onwards, to assist with the overworked fleet already in service, but these examples soon moved abroad to help transport goods around the claimed territory.

Two examples of this class remain in service in Staffordshire on the Churnet Valley heritage railway, but until meeting the gentleman I was not aware that examples had worked through Rolleston or that US style boxcars had crossed the Atlantic.

We continue to present our display at village events, Transport Festival, the Village Fayre and Burton Railway Society's model railway exhibition, staged this year at the magnificent Rolleston Scout Headquarters.

Talks to various societies and local schools continue to be requested. To add interest to

these occasions, the model railway has been broken down into separate sections to create dioramas giving the viewers a real 3dimensional visual of the booking hall, signal box and bridge.

2023 marks the 10th anniversary of the commencement of the project, when about thirty volunteers, not all from the village, attended the first working party. We continue to convene working parties where a smaller, but highly dedicated team carry out tasks vital to the maintenance of this village amenity. In October, daffodil bulbs kindly donated by a member of the community, were planted.

Recently, members of Doveside Women's Institute made a very generous donation.

The Rolleston project is not unique as I am aware of similar station projects throughout the country, but I would like to think that we may have inspired others by our example.

Please come along and lend a hand, without our team this historic gateway to our village would soon revert to the wilderness we found in 2013.



In the first half 'Bill' took us through how jazz originated and developed. This was mainly in New Orleans in the USA and was a product of the slave trade, where people were shipped in from across the world to work in the cotton fields. Such a diverse culture produced 'working' songs, like sea shanties, and songs to reflect their hard existence. Instruments were obtained from disbanded military bands from the Civil War and used in funeral processions at which sombre music was played before the service and then raucous and loud afterwards. All these types of music were demonstrated by the band and clearly showed how the music developed.

In the second half the four-piece band performed well known traditional jazz.

Rollestonian of the Year Award 2022

At the July Parish Council meeting, Graham Jacks was voted the 2022 Rollestonian of the Year and this award was presented at the September Parish Council meeting. Graham was joined by several Scout Group leaders and helpers to receive this much deserved award.

S106 Play area completion

The Parish Council is awaiting release of the final monies from the S106 funds, to complete the next set of planned works on the Meadow View play area. These are to clean and paint the existing equipment and railings to smarten these up, to install a drain through the very muddy entrance from Forest School Street and to install an additional bench.

Craythorne Road playing field and car park further improvements

The Parish Council is pleased to confirm that the further improvements to make this area more accessible have been completed. These include replacing the existing stile with a kissing gate, replacing the old bridge leading from the children's play area onto the top corner of the field with a new stronger bridge, and the creation of a stoned path leading around into Tafflands. Drainage works in the top corner near that bridge to ease the very muddy and often flooded area in the winter, have been installed, along with new fencing and posts alongside the ditch.



Projects update

The "High Hut" at Tafflands play area, which was sadly destroyed by an arson attack earlier this year, has been fully repaired and is proving a real favourite with our play park users.

A morning clean-up session was held in September on Meadow View and Tafflands. The work carried out included the removal of low hanging, dead or dying tree branches around the play equipment in Tafflands play area, as well as the cutting back of large patches of overgrown nettles. The opening into Tafflands from Meadow View also had a large area of nettles and saplings flailed back and cleared. This will shortly be raked over to remove the sapling roots and then levelled so grass seed can be sown. The entrance path is now much wider and you can now see more clearly into Tafflands. Thanks to the contractors, residents and councillors who worked hard on this to improve the area.

The Parish Council and Rolleston Station Heritage Group are completing a grant application, hoping to be successful to secure much needed funds for the renovation of the old cattle dock wall on the Station. This is in a rather sorry state now, requiring rebuilding and repairs to prevent further decay. This is the final area of the Station that is planned to be restored.

You may have noticed the addition of 4 new troughs planted with colourful Autumnal bedding along the railings on Burnside. The Parish Council would like to thank the donor for purchasing these for the village, as well as the Civic Trust who continue to fund 50% of the planting and compost for all the troughs. These are always much admired by both residents and visitors!

Public footpaths and stiles

Maintenance of the stiles and steps on a number of our well used footpaths will be starting shortly to repair some "wobbly" treads and posts, and to install a numbering system, to help reporting of any future issues.

The "Friends" continue to meet monthly to maintain and improve the site. The Parish Council thanks them for all their work.

Parish Councillor Vacancies filled

The Parish Council is pleased to confirm that 2 new councillors were co-opted at the September meeting, so we now have a full council of 11 members. Rolleston is very fortunate to be in this position, as many Parish Councils are struggling to fill their vacancies.

We are also delighted to have had 2 youth representatives from the de Ferrers Academy (years 12 and 13), Evie and Emily, who attended the Parish Council for the last year. Between them they helped Rolleston Kindergarten to set up the community library, which is proving a valuable village resource. Evie has now moved on to go to university and we wish her all the best in her new challenges. Emily will be joined shortly by a new youth representative from year 12 in November and is planning their next project.

Heart Start Rolleston – a community initiative.



It's a sad fact that around 1,750 people die of sudden cardiac arrest each week in the UK and it can occur at any time, in any age group.

Prompt resuscitation can prevent some of these deaths and using a defibrillator can shock the heart back to a normal rhythm.

However, here's an even sadder fact.....

We wanted to train as many residents as possible in resuscitation (commonly known as CPR) & the use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED). Indeed, out target was to train 10% of residents.

To date we have had <u>less than 62 Rollestonians</u> come forward.... To say that's disappointing would be an understatement....

Happily, our sponsor has very generously agreed to fund training for citizens outside the village....and so far, we have had applications from 39 residents in Tutbury, Anslow & Burton.

Funding for places is still available, but the scheme will be brought to an end if we cannot encourage residents to get trained.

Don't let apathy kill your loved ones...invest 2 hours of your time.

We have AEDs at the Cricket Club, the Co-op, Rolleston Club and at the OGS, but they are useless without citizens who can use them.

The course is free!

It's just a 2-hour training session at Scout HQ. There's free parking at a comfortable venue... and all in the village.

Training will be provided to **Resuscitation Council UK** standards by a professional local company who will run the sessions at a relaxed pace with small groups, to give everyone time to train and learn to use the equipment.

Please don't miss this opportunity to save a life.

Doing the training is not compulsory.

But nor is standing with your hands in your pockets, watching someone die because you don't know what to do.

So come on Rollestonians.... Support your community...

If one of my loved ones suffered a cardiac arrest, I'd hope there was a CPR / AED first aider on hand. I'm sure you'd want the same.

Who can be trained?

Anyone from age 14 can be trained to do CPR & use an AED. The devices are simple to use and largely fool-proof. Interestingly, many secondary school pupils are already AED trained!

No previous experience is needed. Maybe you're already first aid trained? If so, you can still attend and refresh / top up your skills.



Chapter & Verse

'Lessons in Chemistry' is the debut novel by Bonnie Garmus. It is about the life of a young woman, Elizabeth Zott, who is an aspiring scientist in early 1960's America. Elizabeth works as a chemist in a research institute, where she falls in love with fellow chemist Calvin Evans who is really the only person to treat her as an equal professionally, and values her expertise. She chooses not to marry and once Madeline, their daughter is born, Elizabeth, who is by then a single parent suffers all the stigma and warped attitudes of the time, eventually losing her job. Madeline, who is very advanced for her age, seeing how her mother suffers from not fitting in, puts on a pretence so she can be accepted. Her healthy lunches that she takes to school are actually devoured by another child whose father works for a TV company and through this unlikely introduction, Elizabeth, desperate for a job, hosts a TV cookery show. She goes totally off script, explaining everything from a Chemistry perspective, and the show is a great success.

This is a fun, easy to read book, taking liberties with almost unbelievable situations. However, the author conveys the attitudes of the time and the barriers to women succeeding in a man's world.

Arnold Bennett managed to be both successful novelist - the bestselling in his era, along with H.G.Wells and John Galsworthy - and also much reviled by influential writers of the day, notably Virginia Wolf. This may have been because Bennett came from what was a deeply unfashionable part of the country: North Staffordshire's Potteries or Stoke on Trent – the Five Towns of Bennett's works, though there are actually six. 'The Old Wives Tale' is the story of a pair of sisters from Bursley (Bennett's thinly disguised name for Burslem) who are young girls as the novel begins, and whose maturation and adult lives, wildly different in some respects but fundamentally both consisting of hard work and disappointment, form the narrative. Although these are very ordinary people, nonetheless the novel deals with murder, capital punishment, alcoholism, infidelity, desertion, mental illness and the siege of Paris in 1870, as well as the minutiae of everyday life. Bennett was criticised for including detail upon detail, and it is fair to say that this book is a slow burn making it a challenge to finish. However, it is well worth it, with the extraordinarily vivid characterisation, evocation of a lost era, and the dry humour which lightens the most sombre passage. Worth seeking out an edition with reasonable size print.
